CAPITULO I

OBJETO, AMBITO Y ORGANOS DE APLICACION

Art. 1.- Objeto.- Este reglamento tiene por objeto establecer la base normativa, técnica y procedimental que permita a las instituciones entidades, organismos y empresas del Estado, viabilizar el cálculo y pago de viáticos en el exterior, cuando las servidoras y servidores se desplacen a cumplir alguna misión especial o transitoria, mediante licencia para el cumplimiento de servicios institucionales en el exterior.

Considerando:

Que, con Resolución No. SENRES-2006-104, publicada en el Registro Oficial No. 346 de 31 de agosto del 2006, se expidió el Reglamento para el pago de viáticos en el exterior, para dignatarios, autoridades, funcionarios y servidores del sector público y en sus posteriores reformas efectuadas con las resoluciones SENRES números 2006-000142, 2008-156 y 2009-000088, publicadas en los registros oficiales números: 377 de 16 de octubre del 2006; 441 de 7 de octubre del 2008 y 586 de 8 de mayo del 2009, en su orden;

Que, es necesario actualizar la normativa que regula el pago de los viáticos al exterior considerando los niveles de atribuciones y responsabilidades de los puestos de trabajo, cuyos titulares se desplazan para cumplir una misión especial o transitoria fuera del país, mediante licencias para el cumplimiento de servicios institucionales en el exterior, mejorando el uso de los recursos institucionales asignados para este concepto;

Que, acordado el contenido del proyecto de la normativa para el pago de viáticos al exterior, con el Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores, a través de la Subsecretaría Administrativa Financiera;

Que, mediante oficio No. MEF-SP-CDPP-2009-2043 de 3 de julio del 2009, la Subsecretaría General de Finanzas, encabezada, por la Ministra de Finanzas de conformidad con

Art. 2.- Ambito.- Las disposiciones de este reglamento son aplicables a las instituciones, entidades organismos y empresas del Estado descritas en los artículos 3 y 101 de la Codificación de la Ley Orgánica de Servicio Civil y Carrera Administrativa y de Unificación y Homologación de las Remuneraciones del Sector Público-LOSCCA y en el artículo I de su reglamento.

Art. 3.- Organos de aplicación.- Las Unidades de Administración de Recursos Humanos (UARHs) o quienes hicieren sus veces y las unidades administrativas-financieras, serán las encargadas de aplicar en la institución, entidad, organismo y empresas del Estado, el presente reglamento. En el caso de los establecimientos educativos estatales, estarán bajo la responsabilidad de la Inspección General o Secretaría, acorde a la Resolución No. SENRES-2006-000126, publicada en el Suplemento del Registro Oficial No. 350 de 6 de septiembre del 2006.

CAPITULO II

DEL VIATICO, MOVILIZACION Y SUBSISTENCIA EN EL EXTERIOR

Art. 4.- Del viático en el exterior.- Es el estipendio económico o valor diario que reciben las servidoras y servidores de las instituciones, entidades y organismos del Estado, destinado a cubrir los gastos de alojamiento y alimentación, cuando estos sean declarados legalmente en licencia para el cumplimiento de servicios institucionales en el exterior, permitiendo fuera del domicilio habitual de trabajo, por un tiempo mayor a un día.

Cuando la licencia para el cumplimiento de servicios institucionales sea mayor a un día, el último día de la licencia será reconocido únicamente con el valor

En el evento de que en el lugar de trabajo en que se cumple la licencia de servicios institucionales no existan sitios o disponibilidad de alojamiento que facilite el desarrollo de las actividades del servidor, este podrá hacerlo en el sitio más cercano que cuenta con dicho servicio y se pagará el viatico correspondiente al lugar donde se pernoctó de lo cual se dejará sentado en el informe al que se refiere el artículo 18 de este reglamento.

Art. 5.- De la movilización o transporte en el exterior.- Los gastos de movilización o transporte son aquellos en que incurren las instituciones, entidades, organismos y empresas del Estado, por la movilización y transporte de las servidoras y servidores, cuando se trasladan a otro país y en el interior de los mismos.

Art. 6.- De las subsistencias.- Es el estipendio monetario o valor destinado a sufragar los gastos de alimentación en el lugar donde cumplen la licencia las servidoras y servidores de las instituciones, entidades, organismos y empresas del Estado; cuando la licencia para el cumplimiento de servicios que tenga lugar en el exterior y su duración no supere un día; siempre que el viaje de ida y de regreso, se efectuó el mismo día.

El tiempo de cálculo de las horas para el cumplimiento de la licencia para subsistencia iniciará desde el momento y hora en que la servidora o servidor se traslade e inicie sus labores para el cumplimiento de la licencia, para lo cual deberá adjuntar en su informe los detalles y respectivos justificativos.

CAPITULO III

DE LA FORMA DE CALCULO

Art. 7.- Forma de cálculo del viático en el exterior.- El valor del viático será el resultado de multiplicar el valor diario que se detalla en la tabla siguiente, por el coeficiente respectivo que se señala en el artículo 8 del presente reglamento, valor que deberá ser multiplicado por el número de días legalmente autorizados:

Art. 8.- Coeficiente por país.- Para el cálculo del valor del viático diario, se aplicará la escala señalada en el artículo anterior multiplicado por el coeficiente que a continuación se detalla de acuerdo a los países, ciudades y lugares a los que viajen las servidoras y servidores que sean declarados legalmente en licencia para el cumplimiento de servicios institucionales en el exterior.

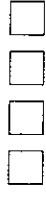

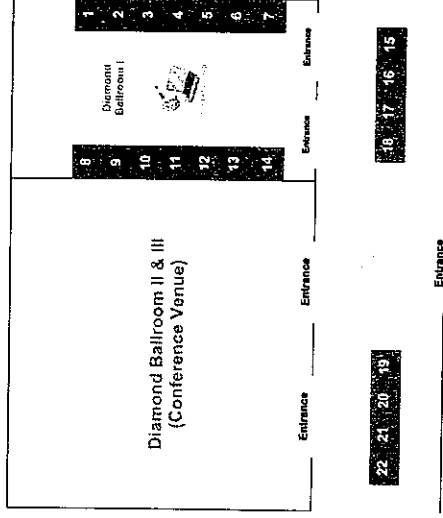
